### What Will Students Use To Complete Coursework?

They will login to Edgenuity to complete their coursework.

#### They will need:

- A quiet space
- Computer, Laptop, Chromebook, or iPad
- A printer to print Guided Notes (Optional, but highly recommended)
- Paper/notebook and pencil for notes
- Wi-Fi



#### **How Does This Work For Mentors?**

You will also login to Edgenuity to monitor your student(s). You will be able to see things like:

- Their login time
- Grade/Progress Snapshot
- Past Communications (You can message with your students and STARRS staff directly through Edgenuity)

#### **Mentor Expectations**

Your role is pivotal in the success of our online students. As a mentor, you serve as a crucial bridge connecting the district, STARRS Online, and the students and their families

#### Mentor Expectations Include:


- Point of contact for student and istrict
  - Help answer questions about students/families
  - Attendance monitoring
  - Working with your district IT department
- Know and useEdgenuityplatform
  - Check in on student performance/ pacing at least twice a month
  - Attend or view mentortrainings/ask questions as needed
- Communicate with and meet with STARR staff, students, and families as needed for student concerns and conversations about progress
- Enrollment forms
  - Monitor graduation requirements
  - Student course load making sure student is enrolled in correct classes
- Ensure that student hasaccess to technology and otheresources (Workbooks and/or technology)
- Work with special education teachers to upload student accommodations and modifications page
- Create and uphold attendanc/etruancy protocols for local district

### **Daily Student Expectations**

- → Login every school day
  - ◆ Pacing requires a minimum of 30 45 minutes per day per class
- → Take notes
  - ◆ If available, students should use Guided Notes (print or fill in digitally)
  - ◆ The option to take enotes is available for all courses
  - ◆ All notes can be used on quizzes and test
- → Check messages daily
  - respond to teachers promptly
- → Reach out via message or email to teachers when they need help
- → If they do not meet these expectations and begin to fall behind, they will be referred to our Multiple Tiered Support System (see next slide)


## Multiple Tiered Support System (MTSS)

If a student's grade falls below 59% and/or they become 16% or more behind (pacing), they will be required to meet the following expectations.



### Multiple Tiered Support System (MTSS) Cont.

If a student's grade falls between 6069% and/or they become behind by 415%, they will be required to meet the following expectations.



### Multiple Tiered Support System (MTSS) Cont.

If a student's grade is 70% or higher and they are on pace to finish, they are doing well and should continue the good work.

#### TIER 1

Universal Supports: 70% or higher overall grade and on pace to finish course by end of semester.

- Students are advocating for themselves, asking questions when needed
- •Expectations sent to every family at the beginning of the semester
- Notebooks and notetaking are encouraged
- •Individual emails or phone calls to students/ family on an as needed basis.
- Encourage Goal setting
- Teacher is responding to student in a timely manner (24hours during the week)
- Option to schedule the live work sessions on TEAMS
- •Bi-monthly progress reports sent through Edgenuity
- Parent, student and mentor sign acknowledgment of expectations



# Guided Notes (Our #1 Tip for Success)


Click this symbol to view eNotes that you have taken for your course

  - eNotes can be added during instruction y clicking the +in the top right corner




#### **Student Dashboard**

#### **Grade Breakdown**


#### **EXAMPLE EXPLANATION:**

- Actual Grade
   — The average of completed graded activities deducting the behind pacing percentage
   amount if student falls behind pace.
- Overall Grade
   — The average of completed graded activities only (past due activities are not included).
- Relative Grade—The average of completed graded activities and zeros for every single activity that's left in the course to complete. This is the grade that will be used for final grades.

If you are on pace or ahead of pace, the actual grade and overall grade will always match. If you complete your course 100%, all three grades will match.
