General Registration

- Available to students in grades K-8
- Register Online: www.swwc.org/ya
- All attending adults must be registered online.
- There is no student/adult ratio at this time.
- Not required but prefer contact person be an attending adult.

School Participants

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

BIGG Shake, recording artist

Sheku E. Bannister, widely known as BIGG Shake, is a multi-hyphenate creative: a recording artist, motivational speaker, youth mentor, and community leader who uses the power of music, movement, and message to inspire the next generation. Born in California with Sierra Leonean roots and raised between East Palo Alto and the Midwest, Sheku draws on a diverse background to connect with students from all walks of life. He is the founder of Survival Records, a purpose-driven music label, and the creator of original works like “Finisher” and “Together We Rise”—anthems that speak to perseverance, faith, and unity. Sheku is also a dedicated youth coach, curriculum developer, and arts educator who believes every student has greatness inside them just waiting to be activated. Through keynote speaking, interactive workshops, and community-driven performances, he brings energy, authenticity, and practical tools to inspire students to believe in themselves, belong to something bigger, and become the leaders of tomorrow. With a passion for young people and the arts, Sheku is committed to helping students unlock their creativity, discover their voice, and boldly live out their purpose.

Michaël Angelou was born Christopher David, in Monroe, Louisiana. At a young age, he got started with instruments and choir in church and started his first music group at 12 with his brother. He is receiving an independent record deal by 13, with Snowtown Ent. At 19, he was brought into and received a deal through Keezo Kane with Kanye West and G.O.O.D. Music. With years in the music industry under his belt, having worked with the likes of Nipsey Hussle, Rick Ross, DJ Drama, Mac Miller, Miguel, The Escovedo family/Sheila E., Prince, Modsun; he is now independent with his brand NoWhere Boy and on3.

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SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

****IMPORTANT NOTE:** Due to limited space and high demand, students can only be scheduled into one pottery session per year attending.

Select sessions appropriate for student's grade level K-2, 3-5 or 6-8

A. Refrigerator Art

Gr. K-2, 3-5 & 6-8

Students will be creating two magnetized foam canvases, investigating colors, shapes and textures. Students will have the opportunity to select their subject matter and will be guided by my experience to complete their painting successfully. ***Bobbie Alsgaard-Lien**

B. Quilting with Paper

Gr. 4-5 & 6-8

Create your own colorful quilt—no sewing required! In this fun, hands-on class, you'll learn how to design quilt blocks using just construction paper, scissors, and your imagination. You'll start with simple squares, cut them into triangles, then mix and match them to build bold, eye-catching patterns inspired by traditional quilt designs. Get ready to make something totally unique—just like you! ***Cindy Bader**

C. Birch Tree Mixed Media Forest

Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

Design your own birch tree forest as we head into fall! You'll use painter's tape to create a birch tree scene just the way you like it. Then get ready to blend rich soft pastel chalk with your finger for a gorgeous sky background. Peel back your tape trees for the paint scraping trick that will transform your trees into a beautiful birch grove! (Bring an old shirt to protect clothing!) ***Diane Bakker**

D. Lyric and Dance Showdown

Gr. K-2, 3-5 & 6-8

Get ready to unleash your inner superstar at the Youth Dance & Lyric Showdown! In this electrifying session, you'll dive into the world of hip-hop, learning to craft your own rhymes and bust out dance moves that will wow the crowd. Collaborate with fellow students to create and perform your own lyrics, while also perfecting your dance routines. This high-energy workshop is all about creativity, teamwork, and having fun.

E. Exploring Printmaking!

Gr. K-2, 3-5 & 6-8

Explore the exciting world of printmaking! I'll show you some cool examples and do a fun demo so you can see how it works. Then it's your turn—get ready to play with different tools, textures, and materials as you create your very own prints! ***Sarah Bednarek**

F. Paper Quilling

Gr. 4-5 & 6-8

Get ready for a whirlwind of creativity in our one-day quilling adventure! We'll twist, curl, and shape colorful paper strips into beautiful designs—like flowers, animals, and even cool abstract art! You'll learn how to roll, pinch, and coil the paper to create 3D art that pops off the page. No art experience needed—just bring your imagination and a big smile! Let's make some paper magic! ***Megan Busman**

G. LOOOONG CATS!

Gr. K-3, 4-5 & 6-8

Growing from the page are long cats, fresh watercolor beasts that will stare into your brightest thoughts! Explore with watercolor and patterns with this mixed media project. Will they make your mom clear off the entire fridge to put on display with pride for months to come? Yes, indeed. ***Melanie Cable**

H. Stick it! Create Your Own Stickers

Gr. K-2, 3-5, 6-8

Get ready to design, color, and create your very own AWESOME stickers! In this fun, hands-on class, young artists can choose from cool pre-made designs or dream up their own. Make as many as you can during class, then take them home to decorate your water bottles, notebooks, and anything else that needs a little extra style! ***Jennifer Christensen**

I. Pointillism: Let's Draw Dots

Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

Students will create a pointillism using just dots, which creates an image or picture. The closer the dots are the darker the image appears, the more space between the dots the lighter the image is. The best part of this drawing style is that it is very hard to make mistakes! You will take home a completed drawing, ready to display! ***Cindy Demers**

J. Circle of Life

Gr. K-2 & 3-5

Students will draw and paint a nature scene with animals in it on a piece of wood using sharpies and watercolors. You will learn the best way to use sharpies, pastels and watercolors together on a piece of wood. Everyone's creation will look different, and everyone's painting will be AWESOME.

K. Squiggly Space Cats

Gr. K-2, 3-5, 6-8

We will create fun & funky squiggly cats in space! In this class, you will learn drawing & painting techniques that get you in touch with your own creativity. It's a good way to practice line work & have fun with it! There is no wrong way to paint a squiggly cat ***Janel Guertin**

L. E-Z Cut Block Printing

Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

E-Z cut blocks are easy to carve & print, no experience necessary! The students will create their own print. You can bring your own 4" x 6" image. A very simple image is recommended. Think cartoon. Or there are samples to choose from. We will print with water soluble ink and a rolling pin. Fast, Fun and Easy! (*Warning: students will be using a knife to carve.) ***Bradley Hall**

M. Air Dry Clay Adventure

Gr. K-2, 3-5, 6-8

Get your hands ready to squish, roll, pinch, and sculpt your very own air-dry clay creation—no kiln, no oven, just pure imagination. We'll explore fun ways to shape and decorate, from adding textures to creating cool details. Best of all, when your masterpiece is done, it will dry all on its own, so you can take it home and show it off! ***Clayton Hubert**



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SESSION DESCRIPTIONS CONT.

N. Dragon's Eye

Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

Create a magical dragon's eye using tempera paint on a textured black paper. After drawing their dragon eye on the black paper, students will learn color theory, how to blend colors, work with a color scheme, add highlights and shadows and how to apply paint to make scales and a realistic dragon eye. ***Tamara Isfeld**

O. Watercolor Blot Sketching

Gr. K-2, 3-5 & 6-8

Engage your Imagination! Kids will get a chance to flex their creativity as they explore abstract forms of art. While learning blotting techniques, students will observe samples of what watercolor blotches and blobs look like. They will then find what sort of fantastical creations will take form with their own drawings. ***Zachary Jahn**

P. Make a Zine

Gr. 3-5, 6-8

What is a zine? It's a self-produced little magazine filled with your ideas, art, humor, photos, etc. Anyone can make a zine. They are like social media on paper. In my session you will learn a brief history of zines, learn about different types of zines and make your own zine. ***Oak Kelsey**

Q. Creative Tangles & Doodle Magic

Gr. K-2, 3-5 & 6-8

Students will learn techniques on repetitive doodling, making abstract finished pieces that look intricate and complex but are actually simple to learn! Students can create their own pieces or choose to fill in doodles on pre-made coloring pages. The instructor will guide students through a few exercises, but students can also spend the time experimenting on their own with class techniques. ***Krystl Louwagie**

R. Crocodile: Recycled Art

Gr. K-3

By blending literature and art, children expand their imagination, develop creative confidence, and explore new ways to express themselves. This playful and engaging class will spark creativity and artistic expression. Students will create a life-size crocodile using recycled paper bags and paint, discovering how everyday materials can be transformed into imaginative works of art. Through visual storytelling, it will encourage them to see recycled items as artistic tools. ***Kathleen Marihart**

S. Chibi & Beyond: Explore Anime Art

Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

Love anime? Come draw your own adorable chibi character — those tiny, big-eyed figures with tons of personality! In this class, you'll learn step-by-step how to draw faces, expressions, and simple bodies, then add fun details like hair, clothes, and accessories. Just bring your imagination and get ready to create something super cute! ***SammyJo Miller**

T. Let's Make Some Music

Gr. K-3

The group will start with a sing along where students will choose nouns, adjectives and verbs to create a song. We will discuss different musical instruments and demonstrate with ones I will bring along. Students will then break into groups and try playing instruments such as tambourines, shakers, keyboards, microphones, bells, drums and etc. It will be a class filled with fun as we make music. ***Tony Moger**

U. Art 101 - Using Different Mediums

Gr. K-2, 3-5 & 6-8

Students will learn art techniques using different mediums and materials. We will incorporate 4 tips when using pastels; keep sticks clean, effective blending, experimenting with different techniques, and protecting finished work. Students will be drawing and painting landscapes using ink and pastels. The rest of the mediums will be left up to the students to use their imaginations. ***Adam Preuss**

V. Lettering Art Creations

Gr. K-2, 3-5 & 6-8

During this session we will explore different tools: paint markers, watercolor brush pens, oil pastels and more to create a piece of artwork you will love. We will go over a few different lettering techniques, color choices and adding details. You will have the option to frame your artwork or turn it into a gift. ***Kady Simpson**

W. Clay Caricatures

Gr. K-2, 3-5 & 6-8 (mix)

Work with Sculpey Modeling clay to create creatures, figures and other sculptures from your imagination. The items can be baked and painted at home. ***John Sterner**

X. Pottery Wheel Experience

Gr. 3-5, 6-8 (mix)

Students will observe examples of finished wheel thrown pottery work and watch demonstrations using soft clay to make simple forms on the pottery wheel. Students will then learn how to use the pottery wheel and work with the soft clay. This session concentrates on students gaining new experiences by working on a pottery wheel. Due to no kiln operator, the pottery will not be saved, dried, fired or returned as in previous years. ***Jim Swartz & Pat Hand**

Y. Drawing : The Foundations of Life and Art

Gr. K-2, 3-5 & 6-8

What do Architects, Car Designers, Fashion Designers, Artists and Engineers have in common? They all need art!! Art is the foundation of all things around us and drawing is the foundation of all design. Join Rancher and full time Artist, Michelle Weber, as she teaches the basics of bringing your ideas to life and opening doors you never knew you could open! ***Michelle Weber**

Z. Natures Art Garden

Gr. K-2, 3-5 & 6-8

Let's dive in and get our hands dirty while creating something that will burst with color and life – nature's art garden. In this fun action-packed class, we'll craft biodegradable seed bombs packed with native wildflowers. Learn the simple process of mixing seeds, clay, and compost to help create vibrant habitats for pollinators in your community and beyond! 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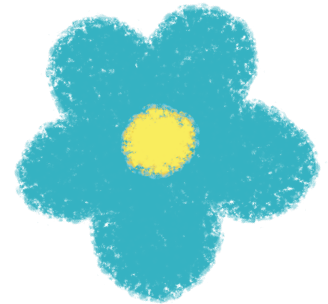
