# **General Registration**

- Available to students in grades 3-8
- Register Online: www.swwc.org/yw
- All attending adults must be registered online.
- There is no student/adult ratio at this time.
- Not required but prefer contact person be an attending adult.





# SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

#### Select sessions appropriate for student's grade level 3-5 or 6-8

### A. Unleash Your Inner Word Artist! Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

Become a word artist! In this workshop, you'll learn how to craft vivid poems using special poetic forms. Discover how to make your words paint pictures and tell stories, using precise language to bring your ideas to life. You'll write your own unique poems and then create a colorful drawing to illustrate your words.

### **B.** Plotting with Post-its Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

We all love Post-it Notes! They mostly help us remember things, but they can also be used to create a new story plot. In this class, we'll discuss what every plot needs, how to carry action from scene to scene, and why it's important to increase the tension from beginning to end. Students will use this technique to generate a unique story outline. \*Jennifer Davidson

### C. Writing for the Airways Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

What does it take to be part of the action behind the microphone? In this fun, hands-on session, students will meet a real radio professional and learn what it's like to work in broadcasting! You'll explore how to write your own radio scripts for news stories, advertisements, and public service announcements. Get ready to turn your ideas into something everyone can hear!

### D. Write and Perform Sketch Comedy Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

SMSU Live: Young comedians have the best ideas. In this workshop, you'll team up with other folks who like coming up with zany what-ifs and show them to an audience. Get inspired with some improv games, then learn the basics of writing and performing in your own sketch comedy show like "All That" or "Saturday Night Live" (but all your own). You might leave with a pad full of ideas -- or a script of your own to develop further. At the very least, you'll exercise your creativity muscles and funny bones (wait, can people exercise bones? Sketch idea!).

# E. TV News in 10 Minutes Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

Students will learn how to gather news by conducting mock interviews. Then they'll use that information to write a news story that will be broadcast ready. It'll all be done by the time class is over and if it's good enough, it may just end up on the news! \*Iohn Lauritsen

### F. Story Sparks Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

What makes a story spark in a reader's mind? What draws readers into a story? A good plot and characters, yes, but how we write also makes our writing more interesting. In this session, we will add to and write scenes for our own stories. Come explore how to turn your words into fuel that will make your story fire! \*Erin Makela

# **G.** "True Crime Detectives" Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

We will be choosing a story from a few vintage newspapers on a true crime that happened long ago. A crime from a rural community called Sleepy Eye Minnesota. We will set the stage for a young lad that went from good to bad. All the students will be detectives searching for clues of a crime. After the group finds the clues, they will be coached in putting together a True Crime Short Story.

### H. "Create A Quest" Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

Create A Quest: Do you love dragons, quests, or magical lands? In this session, we'll explore what makes a fantasy story exciting and believable. Then you'll design your own world, complete with creatures, maps, and characters. By the end, you'll have the start of a brand-new fantasy adventure. \*Afton Northrup

#### I. How to Catch a Poem Gr. 5-8

Write It Like You Mean It! Poems can come from anywhere. A sound, a feeling, something you saw on the way to school or on a vacation. We will talk about how to grab those ideas before they slip away. We will mess around with different kinds of poems, try writing a few lines, and see what happens when you make the words your own. By the end, you'll know how to catch a poem when it shows up and master your craft around it. \*Nick Northrup

### J. Painting with Language Gr. 6-8

The Art of Spoken Word Poetry! Learn about the worldwide art form making space for the voices and imaginations of millions of young people every day. What is Spoken Word? Why do human beings write Poetry? What makes Poetry poetic? Get to the heart of writing poetry with Spoken Word and Hip-Hop Artist SEE MORE PERSPECTIVE. Participants will experiment with language to paint pictures that express their biggest feelings and wildest imagination.

# SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

#### Select sessions appropriate for student's grade level 3-5 or 6-8

# K. Midwest Realism Gr. 6-8

Tell us about your life. Much of my own writing, the writing of authors I taught, and the work of writers I published is about their own lives in their own place. This is called "Midwest realism," and it was the agenda of the day for many years. Lately people and their writing have become disconnected from their place. We will look at the work of many writers from this area who "made it," from Laura Ingalls Wilder to Bill Holm to me, and see how they tell us about their lives and their places . . . and about your life and your place. # L. Mapping Story Worlds Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

Writers are explorers and explorers need maps. A map doesn't just guide the way; it tells a story of its own. In this session, you will begin creating a story by literally drawing a map of your story's world. Together, we will brainstorm ideas and characters as well as discuss a few storytelling techniques to help you develop a unique place where your story can unfold. \*Gillian Singler

# M. Creative Writing Pitch Session! Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

The session is designed to push past shyness and talk with other writers who are as excited about your ideas as they are about their own! We will pitch your ideas for your first or next great book or story! We'll talk about how to get yourself (and others!) excited about what you're going to be writing about. Be prepared to share your ideas and get feedback from your writing friends.

### N. Making it Real Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

Whether you're writing or storytelling out loud, you create a world for your audience. But building a world for your audience to live in for a while is hard. In this session, you'll get a chance to practice using just enough description to create a world for your audience without them getting lost or bored. Get ready to get creative!

## O. Write Comic Books! Gr. 3-5 & 6-8

Daniel R. Bernstrom is the critically acclaimed author of seven picture books, including the beloved "One Day in the Eucalyptus, Eucalyptus Tree". His work has received widespread recognition, most notably winning the Minnesota Book Award for "Big Papa and the Time Machine". His books frequently appear on prestigious lists such as the Banks Street College of Reading Best Books of the Year and the CCBC (Cooperative Children's Book Center).

Further cementing his literary impact, Daniel has earned the Skipping Stones Award for "Goodnight Little Man", an NCTE Notables Award, and boasts two Junior Library Guild selections. His book "Song in the City" was chosen as an NEA Read Across America selection and nominated for the Minnesota Star of the North Award, while "Big Papa and the Time Machine" was featured in the PBS virtual "Let's Learn" program. He's also been nominated for the Cybils Award and several state awards across Iowa, Arizona, and Illinois.
