- 7am: Exhibitor Set-up
- 9:15am – 12:25pm: Exhibits, Game Show, Campus Tours/Information
- 12:25pm – 1pm: Event Tear-down
- Schools are required to transport students to the event and provide a 25:1 supervision ratio.
- The event is free to Minnesota West Carl Perkins Consortium high schools.

 - 1,200 students will be attending at Southwest Minnesota State – Marshall

- 45-minute college tours and information
- 70 minutes of interactive exhibits (80-100 at each site) with industry, college and agency staff available as resources for students. The interactive exhibits are also open to adults.
